### Integrating New Ways of Inclusive Learning in VET

‘Skills for Jobs’ (S4J) strategy to increase quality of formal vocational education, is based on introducing New Ways of Learning through Blended Learning – the combination of various learning modalities one of which is online, allowing individualisation of skills development experiences centred around students’ needs. Digitalised information systems are introduced as well for a more efficient school management. This innovation in education in Albania, is engineered by exceptional national and international experts and builds on high performing VET Swiss model.

During the training and mentoring process in January 2017-May 2018, many vocational education teachers have shown to be early adapters of New Ways. In their work, these excellent teachers combine school and company learning places and experience, include critical reasoning, peer assessment, interdisciplinary project-based learning, research projects, games, gradual practical skills development and other student’s centred learning activities aiming learning outcomes achievement and increased employability. They make use of the industry standards, open course and Virtual Learning Systems customised for Albanian VET system; social mobile media; access updated digital students centred learning materials and communicate in real time through electronic devices.

In April 2018, ‘Skills for Jobs’ (S4J) received the special recognition prize at ‘Albanian ICT Awards’ for the excellent work and the modern vision of conceptualizing vocational schools in Albania. The ‘Knowledge Fair’ event will showcase this innovation of teaching and learning in Albanian vocational schools, providing opportunities for exchange of best practices and extend blended learning application in partner schools and beyond.

'Skills for Jobs' S4J is supporting partner VET school teachers in developing digital learning materials to support teaching and learning and uploading them online. Almost 75% of topics in theoretical subjects in Tourism & Hospitality, Information and Communication Technology and Economy are being tested. General education subjects such as math are reconceptualized integrating interactive and engaging content. The process is supported by accredited teacher training and cooperation with pedagogical, subject and virtual learning experts and is based on a quality assurance model.

*Students portfolio is considered as an important instrument for formative and summative assessment, especially in VET where students participate in many different activities and gain extra skills. Another important issue in inclusiveness of VET relates to gender. Girls have a low representation in VET and quite often are observed gender biased practices in teaching activities, including assessment. S4J aims to tackle this issue through integrated approach facilitated by gender contact point in each institution.*

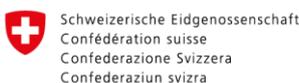
